### HIGHLIGHTS OF ROUND 6

#### BOYS

There were two ties in 12 East 1. with Diamond Valley (3) & Eltham (5) doing well against higher teams. Two other games also had narrow margins.

In 14 East 2A two lower teams, Knox (5) and Dandenong (5) battled out a tie while all four results had margins of 6 points or less.

Waverley (3) won the first game in 14 East 2B, while in 14 Boys Reg 3 Ringwood (3) scored a notable victory against high flying Werribee (3).

In 16 East 1 Nunawading (3) had an exciting 3 point win to score their first victory while Knox (4) survived a close challenge from Sandringham (4)

In 16 East 2 every team has lost two games after a big win by Pakenham.

Ringwood (5) in 16 East 3A toppled competition leaders Waverley (4) while in 16 East 3B Waverley (5) did the same to Eltham (5). There were two ties in 16 East 4.

Look at the ladder for 18 Reg 4 there are six teams on 2 wins 4 losses, and no team with a worse record. Eight teams make the finals in this grade.

#### GIRLS

12 East 1 Frankston teams continued its dominance of this grade.

14 North / Central Nunawading (4) maintained its position after a tight game against Broadmeadows (4). Melbourne (3) made steps to get out of the lower rungs.

14 East 3 There is not much between the top nine teams on the results of last Friday.

16 East 1 In addition to the surprise that Western Port drew with Ringwood (2), Nunawading (5), made a close contest of their challenge against 2<sup>nd</sup> placed Cranbourne.

16 Reg 2 had a tie, and margins of one, two, and five points.
