Most grades will have a top five. However U14 Regional 3 Boys and U14 Regional 4 Boys is a combination of two sections which will each have their own finals.

In the U12 East 3 Boys and U16 East 4 Boys there will be a top five and a second five.

In U16 Regional 2 Girls and U18 Regional 4 Boys, due to an incomplete home and away series, there will be a top eight.

This is to ensure all teams with claims to be a grand finalist do not miss out on a final four because of cross-grade games or cross region games.

Ranking

Finals places are determined by premiership points and then on the basis of head to head results between teams with the same number of match points. (See Rule 7.6 *Rules of Operation* for the detailed working of this rule).

Qualification for Finals.

To be eligible to represent a team in finals, a player must play eight games with that team for EQCBC.

Demonstration of Game Qualification

6.1.1 For the sole purpose of game qualification a player shall be considered to have played in that particular game when the player is in uniform and able to take the court, and signs the back of the scoresheet in a manner that permits identification, in his/her own hand writing on the day of the match, beside their name in BLOCK LETTERS.

If a team can convince the EQCBC they cannot field 7 qualified players the EQCBC may grant permission for a player from a lower grade or age group to play. The player from the lower age group must not be from a higher grade.

Grade Secretaries have now supplied information to Associations about players who have already qualified and progress of other players toward qualification. Coaches or other concerned people should contact their own Association for information.

Timing of Games

Normal game timing shall apply.

Location of Games

All finals will be played at neutral venues, except Bronze Medal games. We will seek to play games at venues which do not require long distance travel where this is practical. Grand Finals will be at Cranbourne or Waverley, or Nunawading, or Doncaster.

Extra Time

An extra five minutes play will take place if there is a tie at the end of normal time.

Conduct

A high standard of conduct is expected from everyone involved with participating teams.

Abusive spectators will be removed from venues. Remember all teams which participate in finals have done well and should receive positive support.

Presentations

These will be conducted directly after the Grand Final. There will be presentations for Premiers, Runners Up, Bronze Medal winners & 4th place, as well as an MVP for the Grand Final.
