### IMPORTANT NOTES FOR ALL PARTICIPATING FAMILIES

\* If you are entering names on the scoresheet, make sure you enter the coaches' name. Otherwise there is a fine.

\* If you are time-keeping and a coach asks for a substitution or a time-out, press the buzzer at the next whistle.



\* Players must pay at the venue at which they are playing. If they are spectators first at a different venue parents maybe able to persuade the door keeper not to charge them when spectating only. This is at the discretion of the venue.

\* A lot of emphasis is being placed on GOOD CONDUCT of all participants and spectators. There are proper ways of dealing with grievances. Abuse and violence are never justified.

### REVIEW OF MARGINS IN ROUND TWO

#### BOYS RESULTS

Overall there were more games with margins between teams being nine points or less (55/104 -> 58/104). However Under 12 results were not nearly as close, particularly in 12 East 3. While most Under 16 results were much closer (13/31-> 14/31).

Under 16 East 3A had 4/4 with the biggest margin 7 points. Under 14 Regional 4 had 7/8 close results. The Under 14 age group continues as overall having the grades with the most intense competition. Overall there were two ties and a surprising eight one point games.

#### GIRLS RESULTS

In round 2 there were 21/43 results had margins of nine points or less, with the North / Central 2 being the grade with the closest results – two three point games, a 5 point game and a seven point game. Even the fifth game had only a 14 point margin
