TOP FIVE AND TOP EIGHTS

Teams should make sure of the system of the finals they are playing, indicated by the ladders on the website.

In the first week of the EIGHT TEAM SERIES it is 1v4, 2v3, 5v8 and 6v7 Winners of 1v4 and 2v3 obtain a rest the following week. The losers of 1v4 and 2v3 play the winners of 5v8 & 6v7.

In the first week of FIVE TEAM SERIES it is 2v3, 4v5. The top team has a bye. The following week the winner 2v3 plays first; loser of 2v3 plays winners of 4v5.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR FINALS

A player must have played and signed the back of the scoresheet in a manner that permits identification, in his/her own writing on the day of the match eight times to be eligible for the finals.

Exemptions:

If a team can convince the VJBL Board they cannot field seven qualified players the relevant body may grant permission from a lower grade or age group to play. The player from the lower age group must not be from a higher grade.

Medical Certificates may be accepted as evidence of injury/illness but not after the last round of the competition.

FINALS PROSPECTS

12 North 1 Girls

The top five seems settled only real issue is for the double chance with Dia Valley 3, Werribee 2 and Broadmeadows 2 the teams in contention.

14 North 1 Girls

Again the top five is settled but the tussle for the double chance between Coburg, Bellarine and Eltham 3 is still to be determined both Geelong teams should finish top two.

14 Regional 2 Girls

Keilor 3 should hold on to the double chance but Broadmeadows 4 are in the hot seat they are currently 5th but are being pushed by Bulleen 6 they meet two teams above them in the last two games a win in either should enhance their spot in the five.

14 North 3 Girls

The top five will not change and the only interest will be to see who obtains the double chance between Whittlesea 2 and Eltham 4, Eltham has the easier draw.

16 North 1 Girls

Altona 2 and Collingwood should hold the top two positions in this very even section. The remaining spots are all up for grabs with the next 7 teams still in contention, Craigieburn 2 (3rd) and Keilor 2 (4th) have a game break on the rest but that could change after tonight's games. They both meet teams just outside the five in Eltham 3 and Bellarine 2. Whittlesea (5th) control their own destiny if they are to make the finals they meet the bottom team this week and then must front up against top team Altona 2 in the last round. Coburg and Darebin need to win both of their remaining games and rely on upsets to sneak into the top five.

FINALS PROSPECTS Continued

16 Regional 2 Girls

This section has a top eight and there are way to may scenarios as to where teams will finish. Bulleen 4, Hawthorn 3 and Warrandyte 2 should hold their top three places on the ladder. The battle for the final top four spot and double chance is between Eltham 4, Doncaster, Werribee 3, Craigieburn 3, Wallan and Corio Bay , all games are important for these teams as any hiccup could mean their demise. Most of the teams met in the upcoming final two rounds.

18 Regional 1 Girls

Melbourne 3 and Bulleen 4 will hold the top two spots Mc Kinnon and Ringwood 3 will fight it out for the double chance, Ringwood 3 is favoured as they have a better draw. Cranbourne 2 and Craigieburn 2 will battle it out for the 5th position on the ladder with the teams meeting tonight which could settle the argument once and for all.

12 North 1 Boys

Geelong 2 have sealed top spot, Coburg, Werribee 3 and Keilor 3 are all in there for the double chance who misses out is anyone's guess. Broadmeadows 2 are clinging on to 5th spot they need only win one of their remaining games to assure them of a finals berth. Altona 2 and Sunbury 2 will be striving to displace them, they meet in tonight's game and only the winner will have any hope of dislodging Broadmeadows 2 from the five.

12 North 2 Boys

Sunbury 3 have locked up top spot and Coburg the second position. Collingwood 2 are under pressure to hold third, they have Craigieburn 2 right on their ginger both teams have hard draws to finish with. Melton 2 and Whittlesea 2 will fight it out for the remaining spot, they meet tonight to decide who makes it into the five.

14 North 1 Boys

Dia Valley 4 should hold top spot and Bellarine second. Collingwood (3rd) should hold this spot but are under the pump from Geelong 2, Wallan and Werribee 2, these three teams with battle it out for the last two spots on the ladder.

14 Regional 3 Boys

Altona 3 are clearly on top but the next four teams are on equal points and every game from here on end is vitally import as to whom achieves the double chance. Coburg 2, Keilor 5, Bellarine 2 and Broadmeadows 2 are the teams and in what order they finish the answers a pineapple.

14 Regional 4 Boys

The top five is settled with Camberwell 2 top, Craigieburn 3 second and Keilor 6 third, Coburg 3 and Collingwood 2 make up the five.

16 North 1 Boys

Keilor 5 and Corio Bay are fighting it out for the top spot clearly ahead of the rest. Geelong 3 are just hanging on to 3rd spot and have the tough task of meeting the top two teams in the remaining two rounds. Melton, Altona and Sunbury 3 are in the tussle to make the five and the best performed in the remaining weeks could sneak the double chance. Sunbury 3 and Melton have the easier draws.

16 North 2 Boys

Whittlesea 2 should finish top and Coburg 2nd. Broadmeadows 5, Dia Valley 5 should hold a spot as they have the luxury of a bye and play the bottom team. Werribee 3, Craigieburn 2, Broadmeadows 4 and Collingwood all have a hope of finals participation depending on how games fall in the last two rounds.

16 North 3 Boys

Nothing separates the top three teams Coburg 4, Altona 2 and Whittlesea 3 they should hold their top three positions. Werribee 4 and Melton 2 are just behind them waiting for them to slip up and somehow squeeze into the top three. Craigieburn 3 have a slight chance of making the finals but they need to win their remain games and hope other games fall their way.
