A REMINDER ABOUT SCORING

In the last few weeks there have been a number of instances where there has been controversy about the scores or the wrong score has been imputed in the online results.

To avoid these situations:

- Regularly check the running total against addition of scores of players
- Check running total against display board
- At next whistle clarify with referees any uncertainty about scores (or fouls).
- **Scorer** adds up scores at the end of the game.
- **Referees** check scores and sign off.
- **All Bench Officials WAIT.** Until scores have been verified by referees in case there is a controversy.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM LAST WEEKS GAMES

In the 12 Boys Craigieburn 2 caused a minor upset defeating Broadmeadows 3 from the higher section, Sunbury 3 top of the ladder in Division 2 came back down to earth with a 22 point drubbing by Geelong 2 from Division 1. In the 12 Girls Werribee 2 upset the more fancied Sunbury 2 team winning by two points. The 14-1 Girls Geelong 2 continued on their winning ways with a convincing win over Dia Valley virtually ending Dia Valley's finals hopes. 14-2 Regional Girls the Northern teams performed rather well Broadmeadows, Melbourne and Bulleen had good wins but Keilor 3 went down to top team Nunawading 4 by 10 points. In the 14-3 Girls Collingwood 2 and Bellarine 2 consolidated their top positions with strong wins and Corio Bay scored their second win of the season with an unexpected win over 4th placed Whittlesea 2. In the 14-1 Boys Wallan kept their finals hopes alive with a narrow win over Geelong and Bellarine confirmed their top two spot with a 3 point win over 5th placed Werribee 2. 14-Reg 3 Boys provided a mixed bag with undefeated Altona 3 held to a draw with Ringwood 3 from the Central section. Coburg 2 4th in Northern section handed out a nice old how do you do to top team Waverley 2 from the Central group defeating them by 17 points. In 14 Reg 4 all the higher placed teams had wins over teams below them on the ladder. The 16-1 Girls Whittlesea had a narrow two point win over Keilor 3 and Craigieburn 2 scored an important win over Coburg. 16 Reg 2 Girls Bulleen 1st fell over the line against 11th placed Collingwood 2 winning by 2 points, could the wheels be starting to fall off the Boomers? Craigieburn 3 consolidated their top eight spot with a 5 point win over previously second placed Hawthorn 3 and wallan continued their charge with a strong win over Camberwell 3. In the 16-1 Boys Keilor 5 moved to top of the ladder defeating previous leaders Corio Bay by an impressive 13 points and Geelong 3 kept their finals hopes alive with a 15 point win over 4th placed Sunbury 3. The 16-2 Boys provided no real highlights with both top teams Whittlesea 2 and Coburg 2 scoring wins and clearing out from the rest of the teams with a four game break. In the 16-3 Boys next door neighbours Werribee 4 and Altona 2 fought out a cliff hanger with the Devils winning by a point, Melton 2 top had a regulation win over bottom team Collingwood 2. In the 18 Girls Bulleen 4 moved to ladder leaders with an 18 point win over Camberwell 3. In the 18 Reg 1 Boys Wallan continued their fine form with an upset win again defeating Ringwood 3 2nd in the previous week they accounted for top team Broadmeadows 2. Keilor 4 and Bellarine fought out a tie which still keeps them in contention for a finals berth. Whittlesea 2 5th put themselves in a bit of a predicament drawing their game against lowly Camberwell 2. In 18 Reg 2A the only two northern sides met with Broadmeadows 4 able to hold out Dia Valley 3 by 12 points. In 18 Reg 2B Sunbury 3 moved to ladder leaders with a 10 point win over Hawthorn 2, Whittlesea 3 went down narrowly again to Eltham 3 by 2 points and Collingwood had a big win at the expense of Broadmeadows 3. In 18 Reg 3 the northern teams still dominate Werribee 3 Craigieburn 2 and Altona all had decisive wins to consolidate their positions in the top five. In 18 Reg 4 only a couple of northern teams and they had mixed results Melton 2 2nd lost to 7th placed Western Port 3 and Coburg 4 kept their finals interest alive with a good win at the expense of Mornington 4.
